**Field Trip Notice:** Members of the Governing Board of the East Contra Costa County Habitat Conservancy (Conservancy) will attend a field trip to view the sites of proposed wetland restoration/creation at the Vasco Caves and Lentzner Properties of the East bay Regional Park District.

**Field trip details:**

- When:** Wednesday, July 30 from 1 pm to about 5 pm
- Where:** Meet at Pittsburg City Hall main parking lot (right hand side as you face the building by the concrete entrance plaza), 65 Civic Drive at 1 pm. Attendees will board vans that will bring them to the two field trip sites over paved and dirt roads and return to City Hall by about 5 pm.
- Who:** The trip is intended for interested members of the Conservancy Board. As a quorum of the Conservancy Board may attend, the field trip is a noticed public meeting and the public is provided an opportunity to attend.
- Bring:** Sun protection, sturdy shoes and long pants. The vans will drive right to the restoration sites, but the above items are recommended so that attendees may walk around a little bit on the uneven, grassy slopes at the sites.
