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Community Capacity Fund Guidelines DRAFT

The Community Capacity Fund is meant to build capacity for existing community-based organizations (CBOs), both formal and informal, to provide ~~helpful and~~ necessary programs, services, and supports to adult and youth community members to prevent their entry/reentry into the justice system. The Community Capacity Fund aims to reduce racial disparities in Contra Costa County through its investments and services.

The Community Capacity Fund will provide individualized support to community-based organizations throughout the County, taking into consideration regions and/or municipalities within the County with programmatic needs which historically have gone without equitable support.

The Community Capacity Fund will emphasize support for programs run by persons of color and/or those with lived experience in the adult or youth criminal legal system. The Community Capacity Fund is committed to providing CBOs support that is informed and relevant, including support provided by persons of color and/or those with lived experience in the adult or youth criminal legal system.

The Community Capacity Fund will be inclusive of developing and established CBOs, including those which may be less experienced with the County RFP process, and will consider the goals and potential of each program even if the application lacks polish in comparison to that of a more experienced CBO.

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
