Report for the July 1, 2021 COH Meeting

Introduction

The COH staff report is to inform the Contra Costa Council on Homelessness of the status of projects happening within the CoC. The report was created to create space on COH meeting agendas for discussion on important issues, to share more information in a digestible format, to make it easier for COH members to review and track ongoing content, and to increase transparency about the work happening within the CoC. The COH guides the content included in the staff report.

Projects

Project Name: Monitoring

Project Summary: As the Collaborative Applicant, H3 is required to monitor compliance and performance of all CoC- funded projects, as well as assess program performance and effectiveness. Monitoring is an ongoing process and is intended to improve program effectiveness and management efficiency. H3 has designated Homebase as a third party to design and implement a monitoring process for Contra Costa's CoC- funded projects. A Monitoring pilot program was kicked off in the Fall of 2020 and is currently underway.

Update: Homebase has finished the monitoring pilot with the three volunteer agencies. Homebase shared final recommendations on the monitoring process at the June Oversight meeting and will work with the CoC Lead and Oversight members to roll out the monitoring process to the other CoC funded providers starting at the end of 2021.

Project Name: Regionalism (All Home California partnership)

Summary: No updates

TA Updates:

1. **CE Evaluation (HomeBase and Focus Strategies):** The CE Evaluation is ongoing. Some of the qualitative components, including interviews and focus groups have begun. Data and information is being collected and assessed to refine the scope and build a workplan from the findings and recommendations. The evaluation should be completed by September.
1. **Equity (C4 Innovations):** H3 met with the TA provider the last week of May to finalize the workplan, which includes a qualitative and quantitative equity assessment of the homeless system, equity trainings, consumer engagement strategy building support, reviewing CoC documents for equity, and a roadmap of next steps. Working on a schedule for the rollout of the assessment and community meetings. Equity training series dates have been set and a call for up to 5 representatives from each CoC agency to participate in the training series has gone out to EDs.
2. **Performance Based Contracting (EDC Consulting):** No updates
3. **System Improvement Advisor (Focus Strategies):** No updates

Project: Quarterly Report to the BOS

Summary: H3 is working on the Q2 report which will be submitted in August. Oversight Committee members suggested adding data by supervisorial district, information on how funding allocated through state budget will be distributed in Contra Costa and an update on housing vouchers allocated in Contra Costa.

Project Name: Policy

Summary: To provide regular policy updates to COH members.

Local

1. **Measure X:** A letter on behalf of the Council on Homelessness was submitted to the Measure X Community Advisory Board. Lavonna Martin, with colleagues from HACCC and Contra Costa Department of Conservation and Development presented at the June 30th Homeless Focused CAB meeting.
2. **Eviction Moratorium:** June 22, 2021, the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors unanimously passed Urgency Ordinance No. 2021-20 that continues a temporary eviction moratorium for certain residential tenants and a moratorium on certain

residential rent increases through September 30, 2021. The Urgency Ordinance also continues a temporary eviction moratorium for certain commercial tenants through September 30, 2021, and takes effect immediately.

State

1. **Governor's Budget**- Will likely present to COH in August once budget and trailer bills are finalized.
1. **AB 71 – Bring California Home Act**- This bill would establish a permanent source of funding and a collaborative statewide strategy for solving homelessness through funding from large and multinational corporations. It requires annual reporting and strengthens data collection at the local and state levels. The funds will flow through continuums of care, counties, and cities. Eligible uses include rental assistance and supportive, affordable, and interim housing and services. This two year bill is on hold until next year.
2. **AB 816 – Accountability**- This bill would establish the Office of the Housing and Homelessness Inspector General (IG) as an independent Office within the Business, Consumer Services, and Housing Agency. This bill is sponsored by Housing CA and amended since last update to include a Housing Trust Fund.
3. **AB 1220 - Interagency Council**- It would create the Office to End Homelessness which would be administered by a Secretary on Homelessness. Aims to coordinate and streamline efforts to end homelessness. Vetoed by the gov last year with commitment to work with assembly woman. Policy Committee wants full COH to discuss this bill.

COVID-19 RENT RELIEF PROGRAM

Please note, this is a state-run program and is *not* administered by the CoC.

- The program assists income-qualified renters impacted by COVID-19 who need help to pay for rent or utilities. Eligible household income may not exceed 80% of the local median income. Eligible renters whose landlords do not participate in the program can still receive 25% of unpaid rent accrued between April 1, 2020, and March 31, 2021. Eligible renters can also receive future rent assistance equal to 25% of their monthly rent. The program also provides up to 80% rent reimbursement to landlords for unpaid rent accrued between April 1, 2020, and March 31, 2021.
