 - Randy Sawyer, who is Contra Costa County's Chief Environmental Health and Hazardous Materials Officer, reported the details of the incident. The Crockett-Carquinez Fire District was in charge but CAL Fire, CHP, and a bunch of other agencies assisted. A shelter in place was given and was all clear at 9:30pm. Hazardous Materials Program tested for particulates and there were 3 teams taking samples. Grass fires also occurred and NuStar did not report the incident until 48 minutes after the explosion.
