Community Capacity Fund Guidelines DRAFT

The Community Capacity Fund is meant to build capacity for existing community based organizations (CBOs), both formal and informal, to provide helpful and necessary programs, services, and supports to adult and youth community members to prevent entry/reentry into the justice system.

The Community Capacity Fund will equitably support community based organizations throughout the County, taking into consideration regions and/or municipalities within the County with programmatic needs.

The Community Capacity Fund will emphasize support for culturally relevant programs and services and diverse program staff.

The Community Capacity Fund will be inclusive of applicants which may be less experienced with the County RFP process, and will consider the goals and potential of each program even if the application lacks polish in comparison to that of a more experienced CBO.

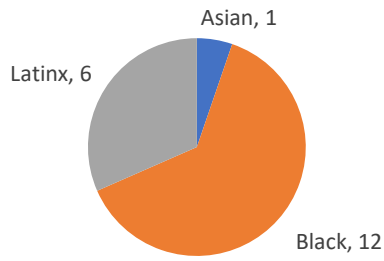

Juvenile Intakes by Race / Ethnicity

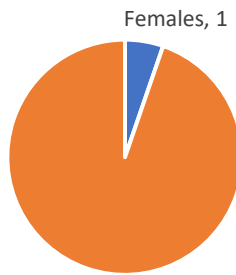

(February '21 Intakes)

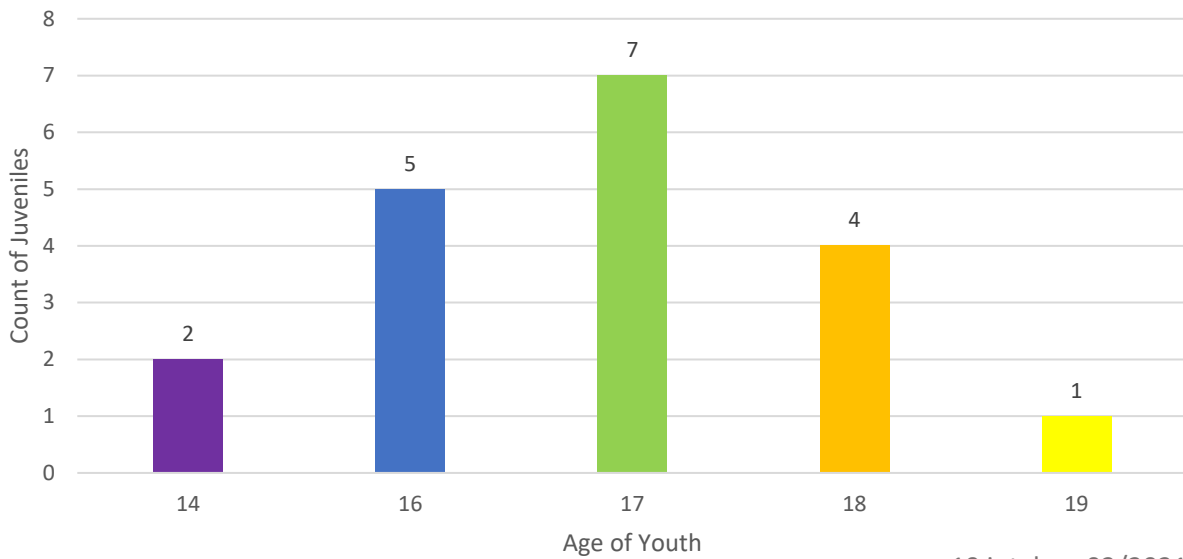

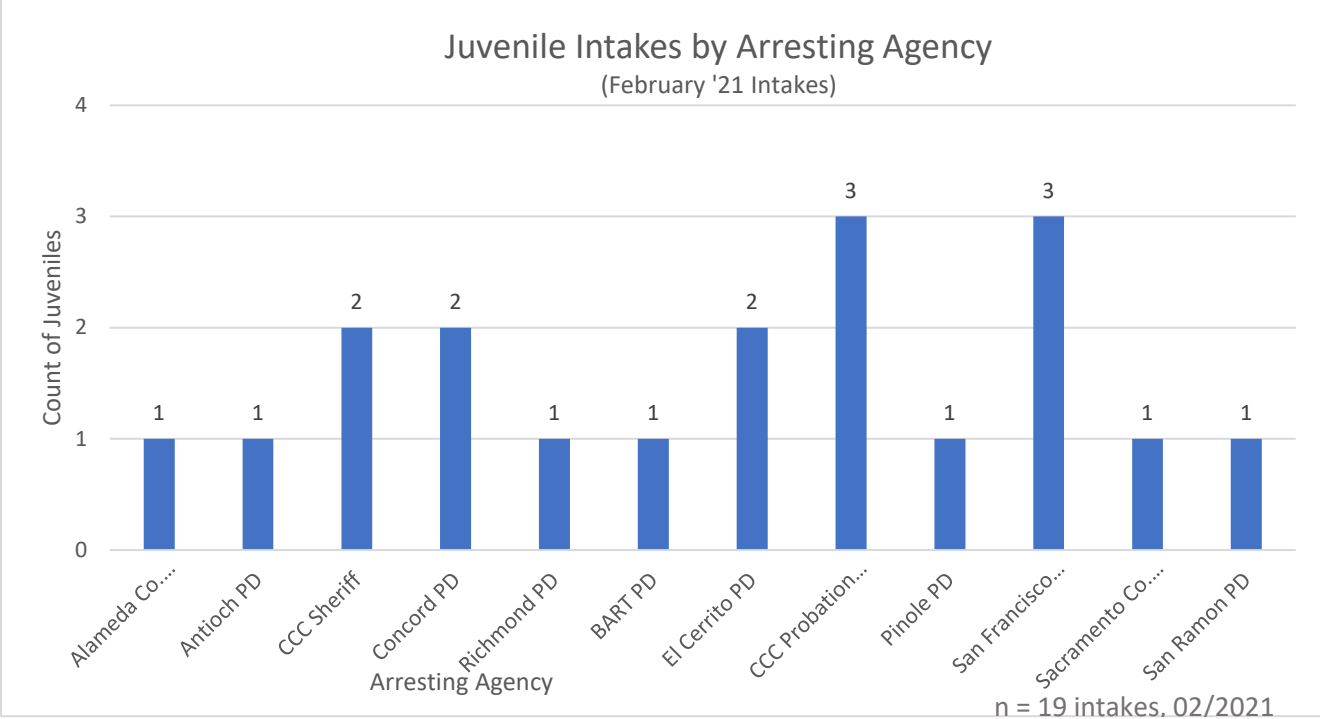
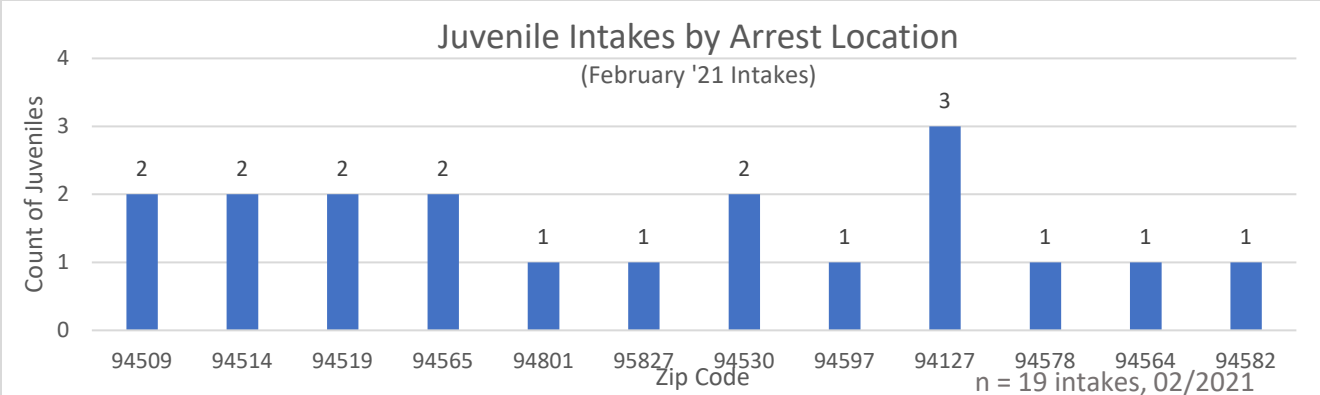

Juvenile Intakes by Age

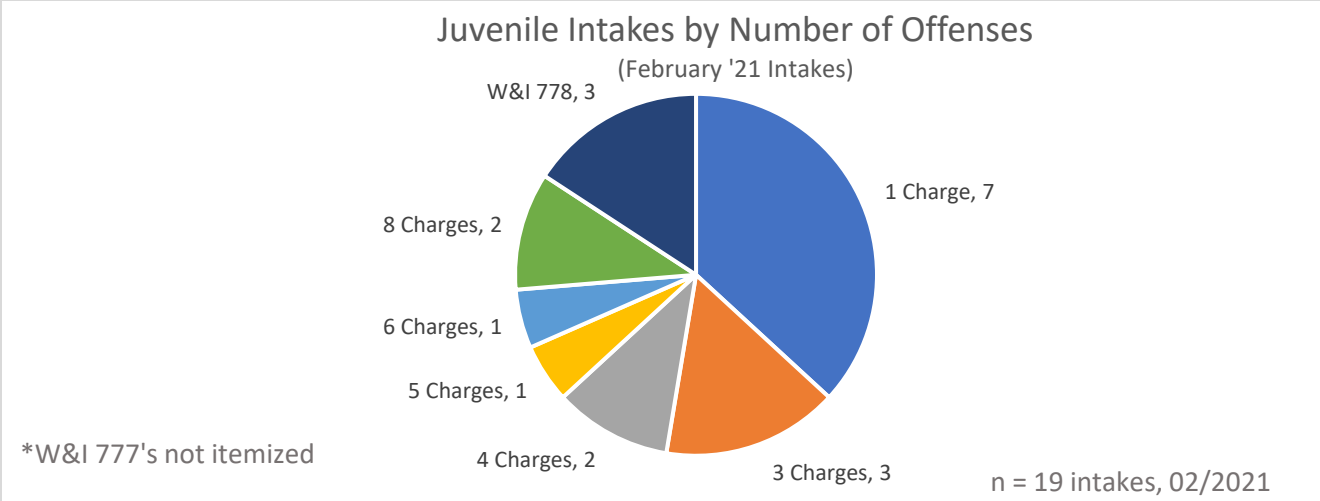

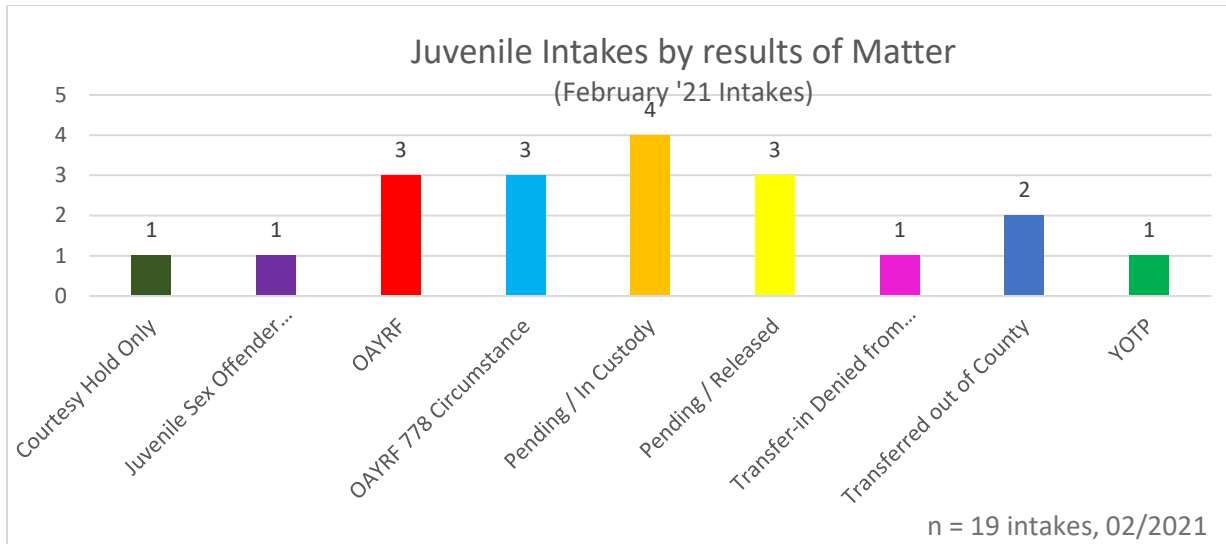

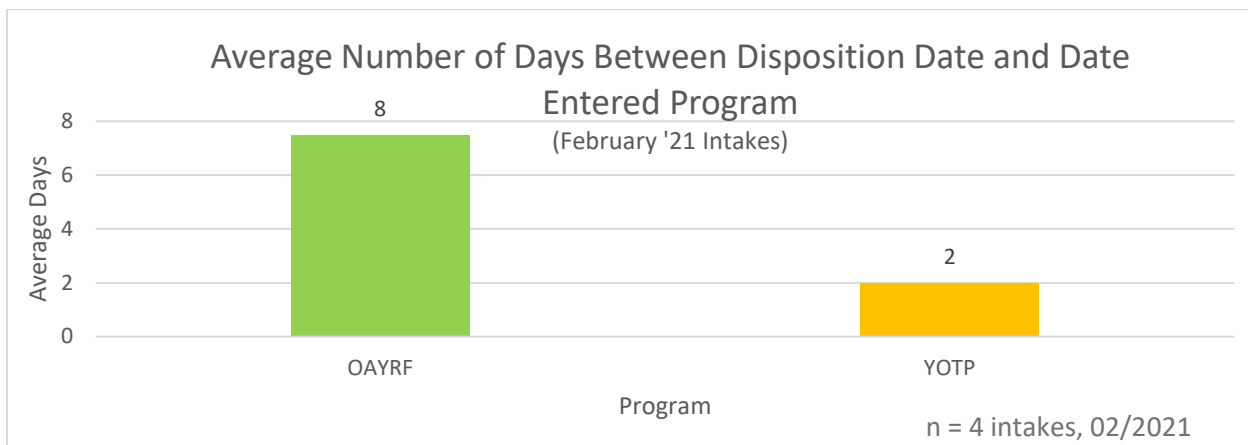


CCC Probation (OAYRF)

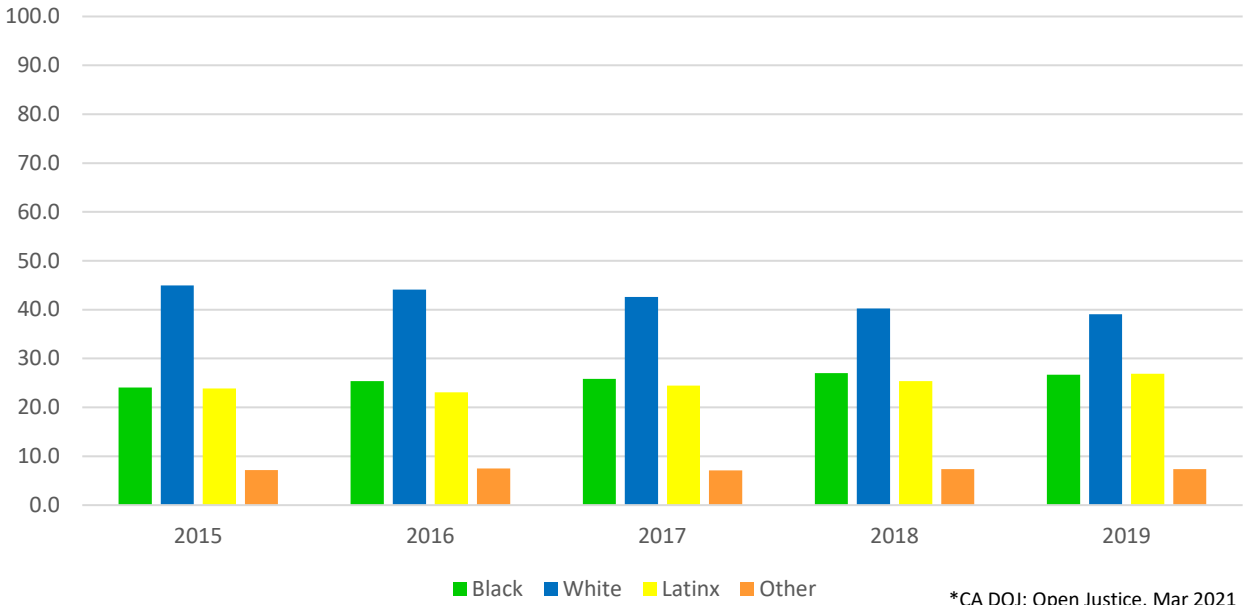

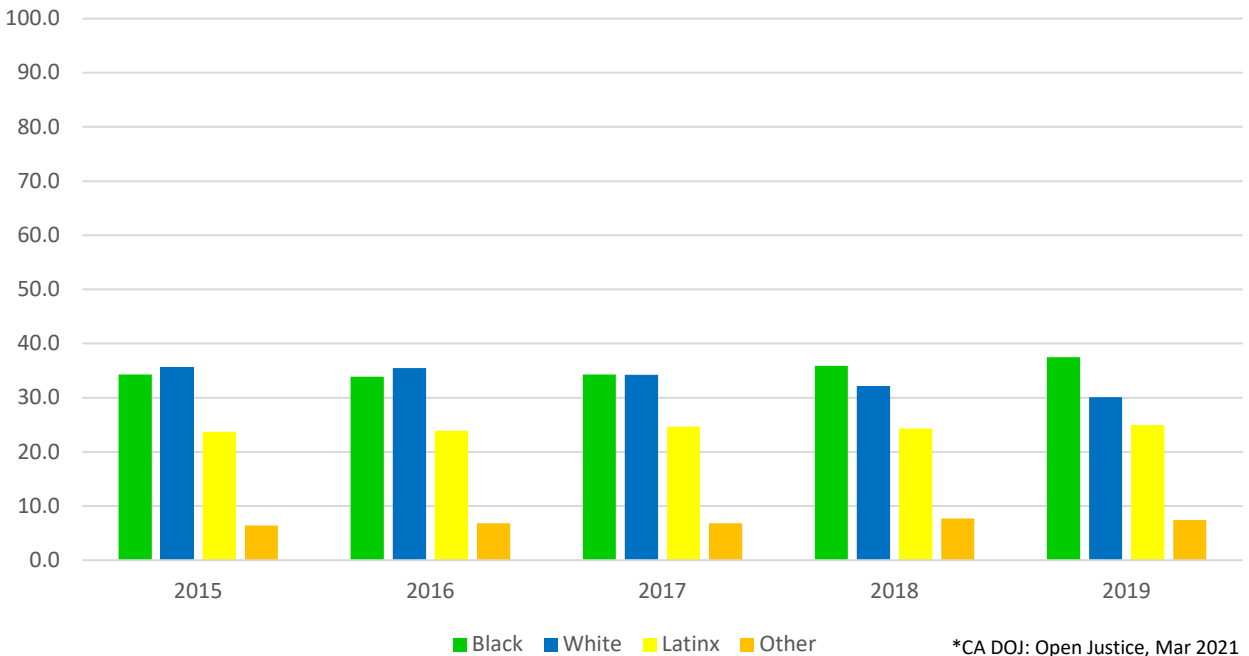

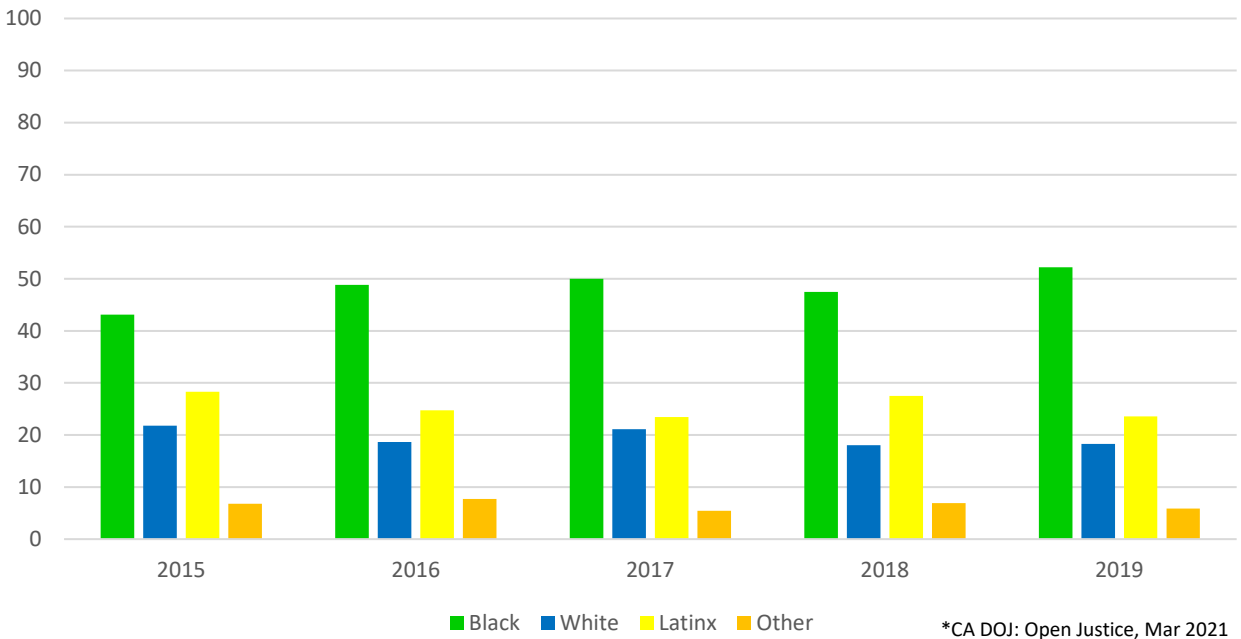
Percentage of Adult Misdemeanor Arrests
by Race/Ethnicity and Year*



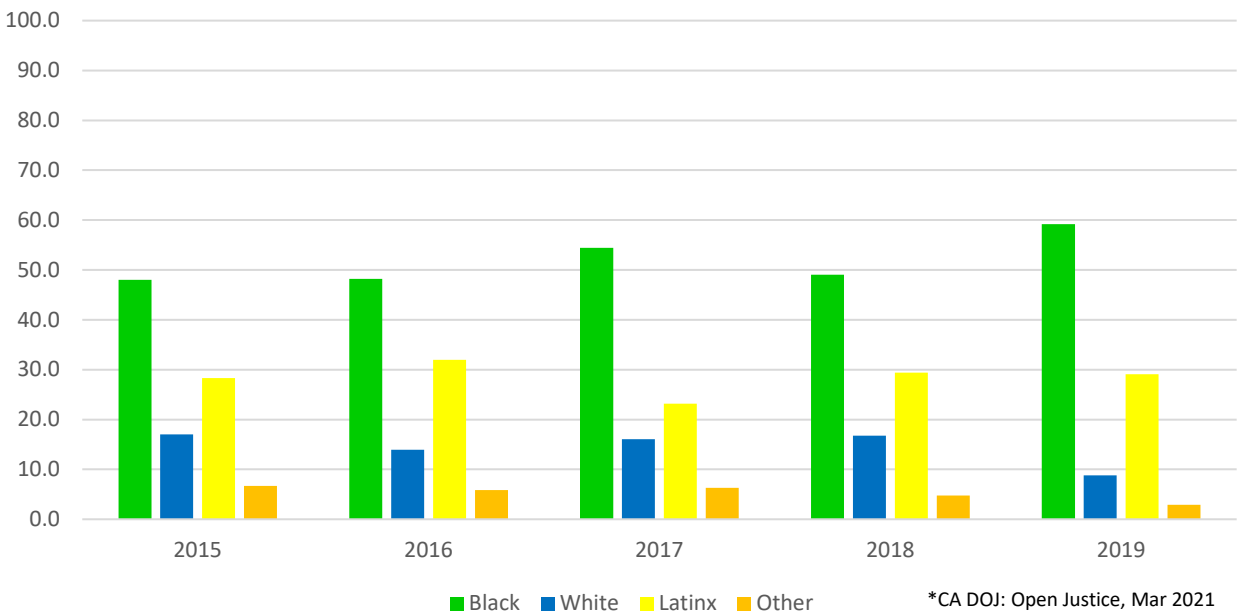
Percentage of Adult Felony Arrests
