Minutes of Meeting on January 11, 2023

The P-5 Advisory Committee was held on Zoom. Rick Kopf called the meeting to order at 7:02PM. Minutes of the December 14, 2022 meeting were approved by motion and passed unanimously.

Public Comment: Alamo resident Robert Oxenburgh joined the Zoom meeting to observe discussion of the issues and events in the P5 District. He commented on the Flock cameras just installed in Round Hill and mentioned that in his area of Bryan Ranch there is a Flock camera that is not registered with the Sheriff's office. Deputy Wallace suggested he locate the registration information and provide it to the Sheriff's office to remedy the issue.

Financial Report: Mark Young reported that he has adjusted the forward looking estimate of expenses beginning in Period 8 (February 2023) in response to the new Deputy assigned to the Round Hill District starting in January. The Flock cameras have been installed and he is estimating their cost as a monthly expense until the actual invoicing is received. He also reported that the Traffic Safety Fund remains unchanged at \$13,417.00 some of which is earmarked for installation costs of the cameras.

P-5 Activity Report: Deputy Wallace who is the Alamo Resident Deputy introduced himself to the Committee and provided us with background information on his long residency and familiarity with the Alamo/Danville area. He informed us of the assignment of Deputy Devin Smith as the new Round Hill Deputy starting on January 16th and the return to duty of Deputy Alex Torres on January 29th. He discussed the residential burglary in Round Hill in December and the increased criminal activity in the surrounding areas. The Sheriff's Department is stepping up patrols to discourage and hopefully apprehend any individuals perpetrating these crimes. He stressed the importance of the Flock cameras and the information they provide as an aid in discouraging and identifying the individuals or groups responsible.

There was no information presented on overtime hours or out of area assistance in this month's reporting.

During the month of December Sheriff's Volunteers did patrol the Round Hill streets and issue warning notices but the exact numbers were not compiled.

Old Business: The Flock cameras are installed and there has been discussion of mounting signs on the poles to indicate their surveillance of the area. There was agreement among the Committee that this is a good idea. Ty Fagg made a motion to attach signs to all the camera poles and this was seconded by Don Magalhaes. The Motion passed unanimously. Additionally Mark Cordone informed the Committee that through the HOA there will be up to six additional signs mounted to poles on private property (to conform to County regulations) to indicate neighborhood surveillance.

There was continuing discussion of how to communicate advice to residents concerning the increase in crime and how to react to and report suspicious activities. Deputy Wallace had previously put together a guide of tips on how to prevent bad things from happening to people and property. This has already been distributed to the residents of P2B. Mark Cordone will be publishing an article in a forthcoming issue of the RH Property Homeowners Newsletter that will cover these issues and also alert residents to the installation of the Flock cameras.

New Business: The Committee would like to thank Deputy Berry for all his hard work and dedicated service during his assignment to Round Hill patrol. His efforts to control costs but enhance patrol coverage have been very much appreciated. He will definitely be missed in the neighborhood and the Committee hopes that whatever new assignments he undertakes be as successful and appreciated as was his time in Round Hill.

Cameron Collins informed the Committee that an Alamo Town Safety Meeting will be held at Stone Valley Middle School on February 22nd at 6:00PM. Sheriff Livingston and Lt. Wooden will both be in attendance. Cameron also reminded all Committee Members that they need to complete the Brown Act and Ethics Training and return to her the Certificate of Completion.
