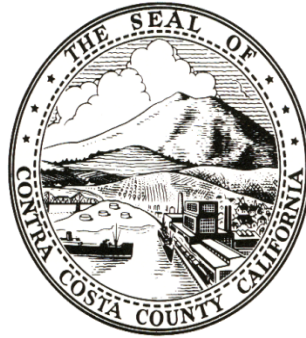

1. Call to Order/Roll Call/Pledge of Allegiance

5. Agency Reports. The MAC received the following reports:

- a. **Supervisor Glover, Vincent Manuel** – We received a COVID update, County will be moving to orange level, residents are encouraged to get their vaccination if they have not done so. The first of several grant writing workshops was completed, if you attend 3 of the 4 you will receive a certificate of completion. Keller Mitigation will soon be starting their new funding cycle. On April 9th the Fire District will have a breaking ground event

at the site of the new fire station. The welcome to Bay Point sign continues to be vandalized on a regular basis but a kind and caring citizen keeps cleaning it up.

- b. Contra Costa Sheriff – Lt. Gackowski**– Lt. Gackowski was unable to attend so Deputy Proctor gave the report. Things have been getting busier with the nice weather, home burglaries are down but auto break ins are up. Residents are encouraged to have cameras at their homes.
- c. Code Enforcement – Joe Losado** - Joe reported that they had opened 13 new cases, closed 27 and have 62 active cases. He expects things will pick up in the spring and they are once again short staffed. He gave a slideshow as a quarterly report, it was really helpful to see a visual of the impact all their hard work is having on the community.
- d. California Highway Patrol** – unable to participate this month
- e. Golden State Water – Tina Gonzalez** – Tina reported that they continue with maintenance. They had recently done a clean-up of Evora Rd. They have received clearance to remove the water tanks that are visible from the freeway.
- 6. Items for Discussion and/or Action** – The board had a discussion about Ambrose Recreation and Park and the lack of services that we have had in the past year. Other communities have gotten creative and provided virtual services to their residents, we can't even get Ambrose to use zoom for their meetings so the public can attend virtually. We invited the Ambrose General Manager three times to make a presentation to our board but he has declined.
