Officers will be vigilant about issuing 72 hour move tickets. Question from the public: Is there parking signage behind Troy's? Question from the public: What can be done about 4<sup>th</sup> Street speeders. Question from the public: Cross walk at 6<sup>th</sup> Street is poorly light. Could it be lighted? Questions from the public: Who does someone contact for a neighborhood problem like noise and parking?
