 Alex Michel provided an overview of the regular Continuum of Care (CoC) NOFO opportunity by presenting informational slides of the national and local agencies, background, funding distribution, how to apply for funding, two-part selection process, local application process, and brief timeline. The H3 team encouraged renewal and new agencies to attend the mandatory Technical Assistance Workshop on July 26th, 10:00am – 12:00pm.

a. Point-in-Time Count Committee: 2023 PIT Count Update
 Christy Saxton went over the Point-In-Time (PIT) Count with a definition and why it is important. Infographics of the 2023 PIT Count were shown as well as key takeaways. The H3 team also shared other important work that is being done such as additional interim housing at a motel in West Country, a new HomeKey application put together from the City of Richmond for a permanent supportive housing program, a permanent supportive housing program in San Pablo by H3 this Fall, the partnering of H3 with the City of Richmond, and the increase of H3’s core team for outreach efforts for evenings and weekends. Jamie Schecter proceeded to report that the story mapping data, from the GIS geographic information, will be shared in the annual report that will be released in a few weeks.

b. Funding Committee:
 Alex Michel gave a report out of the Funding Committee and mentioned that this committee met monthly from February to May to review the 2023 renewal and new housing project scoring tools. The Funding Committee memo was shared with the meeting materials, which includes items for future action from Funding Committee discussions. Alex encouraged members to read the full memo.

c. Youth Action Council (YAC):

Juno Hedrick shared that the group met recently, and some members talked about their experiences and shared some thoughts on how the system of care can be improved. The Council will use this information for debriefing purposes and keep working on making connections with Life Learning Academy where they have been invited to tour the campus and strengthen the work.

a. Update: Council In-Person Quorum, Committee Membership, and Documentation:

Jamie Schecter provided a quick summary of the COH members' attendance records and went over the type of documentation still pending from some members. Per the Brown Act advisory rules, the number of absences and virtual attendance records per COH member was shared. Jill Ray explained that once a COH member reaches a maximum of 2 virtual attendances, the person becomes a non-voting member and therefore, he/she cannot vote for a motion if attending virtually but members can still vote if they attend in person. Jamie also shared the COH members' membership by committee name and asked members to reach out to H3 if changes need to be made. A slide with COH members name and documentation status was posted. Jamie requested members with pending items to submit documentation as soon as possible.

b. Funding Updates:

There were no major funding updates to share for this meeting, but a few COH members made the following announcements: a) Leslie Gleason would like to receive information regarding the CalAIM program with managed health care providers and CCHP involvement. Jamie Schecter responded that information about this topic will be brought in the COH August meeting; b) Tony Ucciferri shared that HUD will release the stability housing vouchers on November 1, 2023. There will be a total of 41 vouchers and will be distributed through Coordinated Entry System to the Housing Authority agency.

The team shared informational slides about the Peer Support Behavioral Health program with four definitions and descriptions, people with lived experience of homelessness (PWLE) with definition, engagement and impact, the overlap between the peer support and PWLE, and type of partnerships to building on. Jo Bruno encouraged members of the Council to take this program to make the system stronger and explained that the California Association of Mental Health Peer Run Organization (CAMPHPRO) is the lead legislative moving body that is making the Peer Support program what it is in California. NATIONAL PLAYERS

- **HUD** – U.S. Department of **Housing and Urban Development**. Federal Government agency that releases money and sets program rules.
- **CoC** - **Continuum of Care**. Funding stream for permanent housing with services for people experiencing homelessness. Also used to broadly refer to the group of community stakeholders.
- **NOFO** – **Notice of Funding Opportunity**. Term used for many different funding programs, but today we mean specifically the notice for HUD CoC funding.

- Funding is awarded in **one-year grants**
- Funding used to **end homelessness**

HUD releases an annual Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)

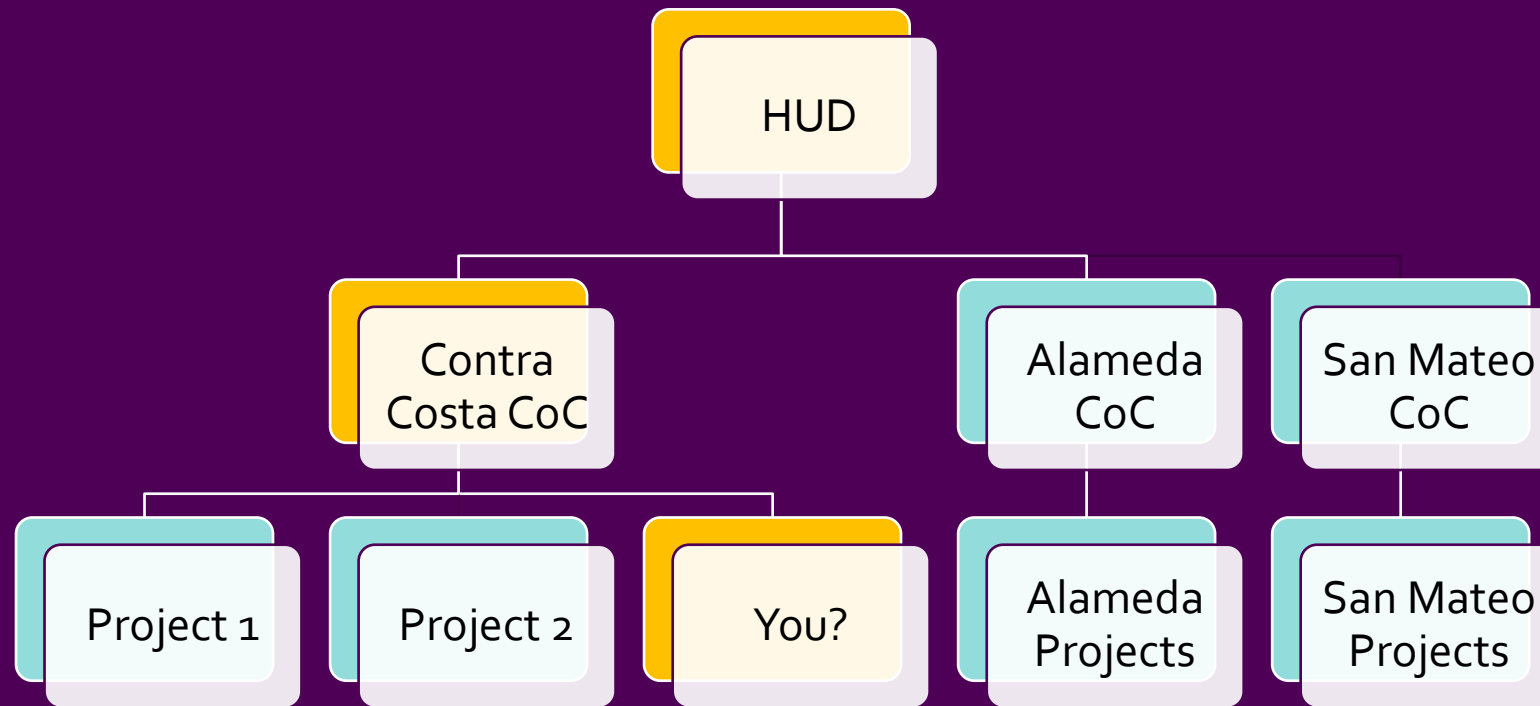


Each CoC submits a Consolidated Application to HUD

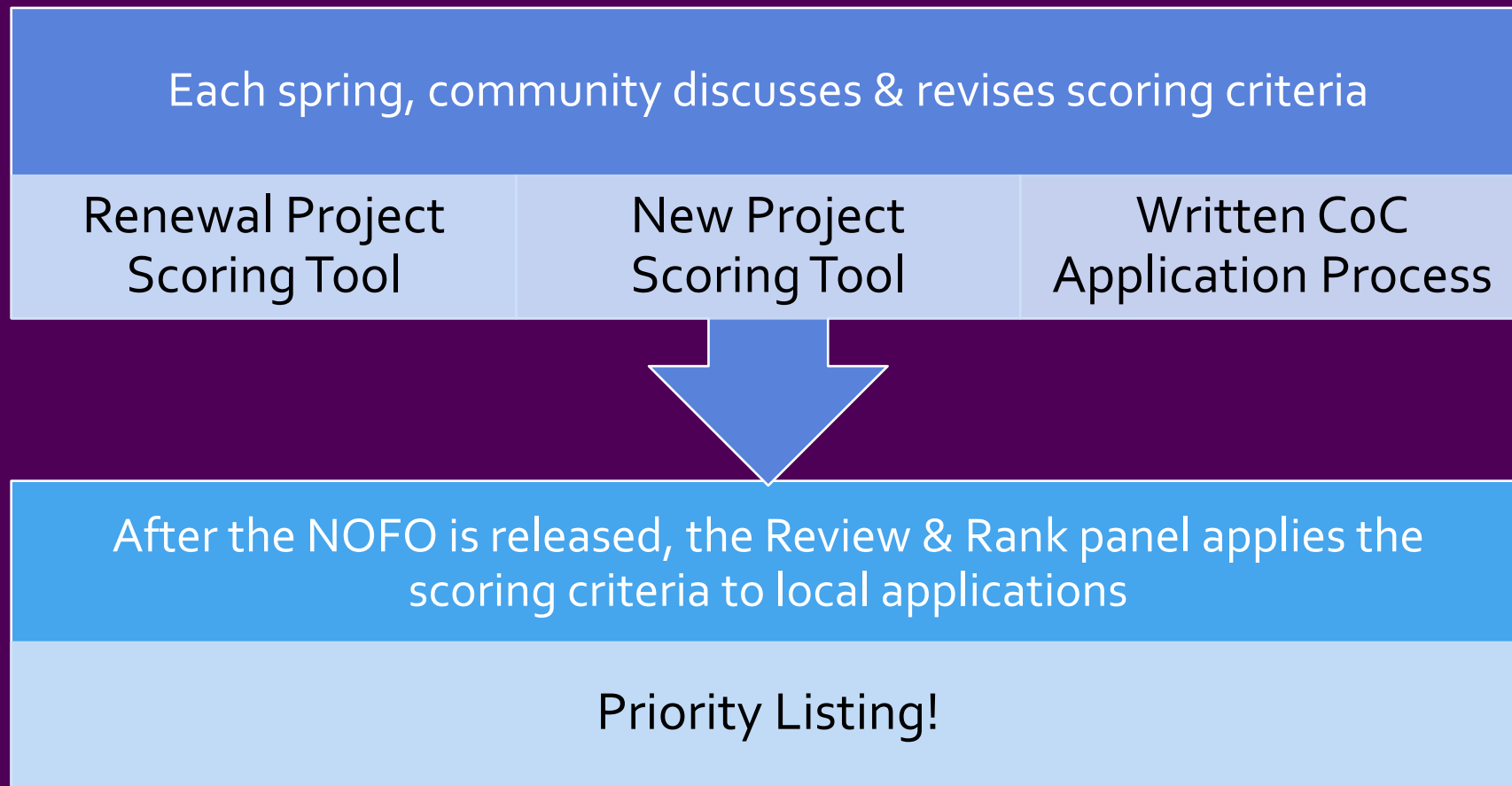

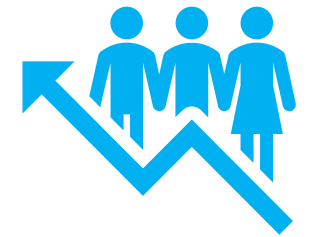

WHAT IS THE POINT-IN-TIME (PIT) COUNT

What is PIT: A count of all people living in emergency shelter, transitional housing, permanent housing programs, or places not meant for human habitation (tents, cars, etc.) on a given night during the last week of January.

Why we do PIT: Each Continuum of Care (CoC) must conduct a study of community homelessness every two years (Contra Costa usually performs an annual count). This count is a requirement of all communities who receive funding from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Many communities do not have a robust HMIS system, and PIT is the best measure they have for tracking homelessness.



CONTRA COSTA COUNTY 2023 HOMELESS POINT-IN-TIME COUNT

The 2023 Point-in-Time (PIT) Count identified a 4% increase in the total number of people observed experiencing homelessness on a given night in Contra Costa County since 2020. This is a modest increase given California's ongoing housing crisis, the impact COVID-19 had on housing stability and resources, and the continued economic challenges.

Contra Costa is dedicated to increasing capacity for interim and permanent housing with new grants directed at increasing prevention programming and housing opportunities.

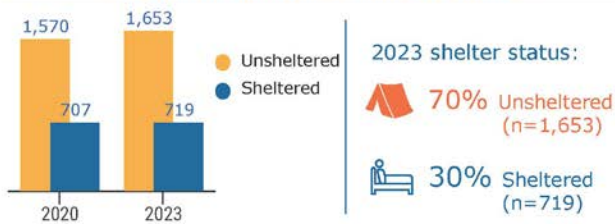

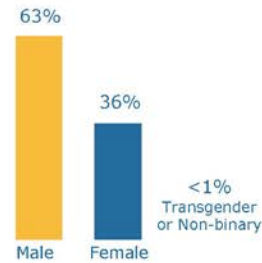

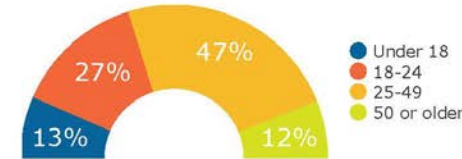
SLEEP SETTINGS ON THE NIGHT OF THE COUNT

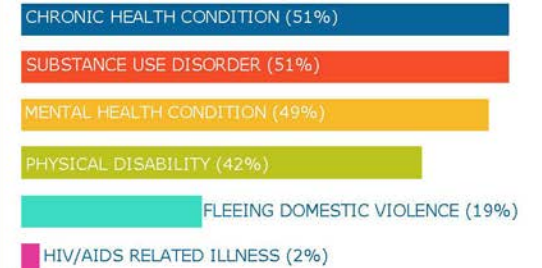

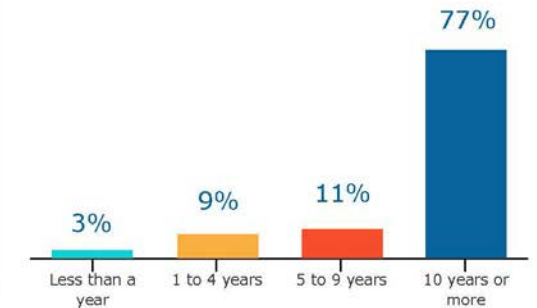

METHODOLOGY

- The 2023 PIT Count methodology followed the Housing and Urban Development's guidelines for a "night of" observational count followed by a random sample survey to gather demographic data and homeless experience.
- A household falls under chronic homelessness if the head-of-household has a disabling condition and has been homeless for 12 months or more in the last year or 12 months or more over four or more episodes during the last three years.
- Unaccompanied youth (<18), and unaccompanied young adults (18 to 24) are youth who do not live with a parent or guardian.

KEY TAKE-AWAYS

- Homelessness numbers similar to “pre-COVID-19” days with just a 4% increase since 2020
- Inequities persist and the CoC is committed to ongoing work to correct disparate experiences across racial groups
- PIT is a one day “snapshot” but trends in HMIS for the number of people served and in sub-populations are similar to PIT findings
- Bed capacity increased since 2020 by 536 beds

Funding Committee

The work of the Continuum of Care/Emergency Solutions Grant (CoC/ESG) Committee, namely to update materials and prepare for the annual Continuum of Care Notice of Funding Opportunity (CoC NOFO) competition, will now take place within the Funding Committee.
- At the last committee meeting on 5/25, the committee decided on recommended revisions to the New Housing Project Scoring Tool and Application Process for the FY 2023 CoC NOFO competition. Those revisions will be reviewed and considered for approval at the 6/1 Council on Homelessness meeting.
- The next committee meeting has not been scheduled yet but will take place in either July or August. Committee members will be contacted via email for scheduling.

Governance Committee

- The purpose of the Governance Committee is to review and revise the [Governance Charter and Bylaws](#) to increase efficiency and impact in the Council on Homelessness. This ad hoc committee met monthly from February to May 2023 on the 4th Thursday from 1-3pm (starting on 2/23).
- At the 5/25 committee meeting, the committee decided on recommended revisions to the Council on Homelessness Governance Charter and Bylaws. The next step is for the document to go to County Counsel for legal review. Once that is complete, the document will either go to the Council on Homelessness for review and approval, or back to the Governance Committee if there are substantive changes made by County Counsel.
- There are no further scheduled Governance Committee meetings in 2023.

HMIS (Homeless Management Information System) Policy Committee

Plan to Accelerate Transformative Housing Innovations Committee

In the June 2023 meeting, the PATH Innovations Committee received an update on the work of the Prevention Learning Cohort from a consultant from Community Solutions. The update included discussion of a coordinated prevention system framework, key concepts, stratifying risk of homelessness, and access points, among other topics. Committee members discussed the interplay between a centralized system and access points in the community. The Committee also received an update on the recent passage of funding recommendations from Measure X and other funding sources by the Board of Supervisors. The Committee heard a presentation on the HomeSafe program from staff at Adult Protective Services. The program serves elder and dependent adults who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness and provides housing stabilization, housing navigation, and other supports. Finally, the Committee received an update about a story map that will be used to supplement and expand on Point-in-Time Count reporting. The Committee discussed how the story map can help illuminate data for both the region as a whole and for particular cities and areas within the county.
