Minutes of Meeting on August 10, 2022

The P-5 Advisory Committee met at Round Hill Country Club. Rick Kopf called the meeting to order at 7:05PM. Minutes of the July 13, 2022 meeting were approved and passed unanimously.

Public Comment: none

Financial Report: Mark Young distributed the Financial Report. FY 21-22 year end numbers are now complete. There has been a reduction in officer expense due to Deputy Berry's disability leave. Overtime expenses were increased for the same reason but were less than anticipated. The Flock system expense has been moved to FY 22-23 due to delays in contract negotiations. The annual expense rose by only 1% over FY20-21. Forecasts for a 3% per year increase in expenses are anticipated and with the Flock system payment due in FY 22-23 the reduction in FY 21-22 will help to offset that capital expense.

P-5 Activity Report: Deputy Alex Torres reported that the Round hill area has been free of any major crimes with the majority of calls due to younger residents parties and summer time late night gatherings. There has been an uptick in residential and commercial burglaries in Alamo but not in Round Hill proper. He discussed the Rolex robberies in Danville and commented that arrests have been

made due to information collected by the Flock camera system. Overtime hours for July were 99.5 hours. These are higher due to Deputy Berry's work schedule being filled with other Sheriff's Department personnel. Out of area assistance was 10 hours and 57 minutes for July. The radar trailer will be positioned at various locations to alert drivers to their speeds and is scheduled to alternate locations within Alamo. There were no stolen vehicle identified by ALPR cameras through the area during the month of July.

During the month of July Sheriff's Volunteers patrolled 128 (965YTD) Round Hill streets and issued 31 (185YTD) warning notices.

Old Business: There was further discussion on the Flock camera system and the increase in cost to store video information for a year at \$300.00 per camera. A new motion was made by Jason Dudum to approve payment using P-5 funds to cover the cost of six cameras at \$2500.00/yr. per camera and an additional payment of \$300.00/yr. per camera to extend retention of the video records for one year. In addition the one time installation fee of \$250.00 for each camera is included. This was seconded by Jason Hill installation and carried unanimously. As previously discussed partial payment for the Flock system will include use of the Traffic Safety Fund.

New Business: none
