2. **Approval of Agenda and Record of Actions** / Motion made by: Clover Mahn Seconded by: Theresa Foglio Vote: 4-0
3. **Presentation**
 - a) California Highway Patrol (CHP)
 - Officer Wilkenfeld informed us that the RV's around town move around, which is good. The CHP participated at the safety day with P6. Side shows are difficult to prosecute however with the help of a helicopter 2 owners and some spectators were cited and they were not out of towners, they were Contra Costa County residents.
 - b) Contra Costa County Sheriff's Office
 - Lt. Buford informed us that crime is down. He has not received one call from a Rodeo resident, so things must be going well. We have a new Bayo Vista Deputy. The California/Mariposa shootings are under investigation and cannot be discussed. There was a sideshow on July 4 and lots of fireworks around Rodeo. There has been an increase in license plate thefts and exchanges so check your plates and be sure to call the Sheriff's Department if something comes up. Please stay aware for potential home burglaries because the culprits work in teams.
 - c) Rodeo-Hercules Fire Protection District Report
 - Johnson informed us that fire season was in full swing and that the grass in the Bayo Vista community has been burned off. There were 111 calls, 63 medical and 1 structure. It was asked that there would be more frequent representation from the Fire District at the MAC meetings. A child was injured when a hydrant was opened, be careful because they have a ton of pressure.
 - d) John Sweet Unified School District (JSUSD)
 - School Board Member Deborah Brandon informed us that school open yesterday and prior to opening staff had a training from Black Lives Matter. The JSUSD is using restorative practices. When there are problems, amends are made in an inclusive/supportive environment rather than using suspension and an excluding environment.
3. **Supervisor Glover's Update** – Dominic Aliano, District Representative
 - The staff report was read into the record by Clover Mahn. Anthony Hodge mentioned that he wants a staffer to be in attendance at the RMAC meetings. That would assure prompt delivery to and from the Supervisor.
4. **Public Comments (2 Minutes per speaker)**
 - Jacob Ryan – Has talked to Supervisor staff and there is not satisfactory results with the trash and weed problem in Rodeo. Asked about getting p66 money for picking up trash, but Anthony Hodge stated that he was going to help him. Mr. Ryan only wants to cover the dump fee and will donate his time.
 - Deborah Brandon – Was denied access to the application for a grant because the links have been changed.

- New Horizons reported on the block party and mentioned that they gave away 5 bikes with helmets and backpacks with school supplies. Zion Hill Baptist Church donated money, P66 donated gift card. No one from Supervisors office or p66 attended. Anthony Hodge stated "if you are not part of the solution, you are the problem." The Thanksgiving feast is free to the community November 22 from 12pm to 3pm. Christmas feast is free December 20 from 12pm to 3pm.

- Marina Ramos gave the presentation for the grant and started off by returning a check of \$125.00 from the last grant that she received for the Rodeo Youth Mentoring. These events are free for all and include pumkin carving, tree lighting, egg hunt.
