5. Agency Reports

a. Supervisor Federal Glover - Vincent Manuel- Supervisors are getting back from their summer break, all negotiations have been completed. County Health has vaccinations for Monkey Pox and COVID booster available. Supervisor Glover will be Board Chair in 2023.

b. Contra Costa Sheriff's Office – Lt. Meth – Lt Meth shared that Deputy Valentine had short kids sports program over the summer. He also reported that they had received several grants from Keller Mitigation for several programs in Bay Point,

including cameras to help with code enforcement.
