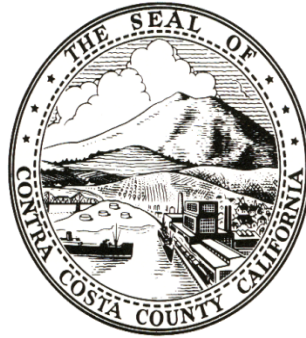

5. Presentation:

CCC Adopt-A-Road Program Review – Richerd Herd and Chris Lau – The MAC received a review of the program policies and procedures, now that COVID procedures are not as restrictive.

a. Supervisor Glover – Vincent Manuel – Reported that the return of Supervisor Glover's Youth Summit had been a success. He also reminded us of the upcoming November Clean up on November 4th and the turkey giveaway on November 17th. The Sheriff's Christmas Dinner will be on December 20th at the Ambrose Community Center.

b. Contra Costa County Sheriff's Dept. – Lt.Meth – Lt. Meth said that the Christmas dinner will be smaller this year. He has academy staff to help with the event. The bike

rodeo will also be smaller due the availability of bikes to purchase, will be using Amazon this year. Graffiti was brought up as a concern again and he shared they would be taken a friendlier approach. It was suggested that a friendly letter and the offer of free paint to residents that fences are frequently tagged would be a possible approach. They had attempted to have a illegal dumping sting operation but were unable to but they will reschedule.

- c. **California Highway Patrol – Officer Thomas** – no report
- d. **Code Enforcement – Joe Lasado** - Joe shared that graffiti is also a problem for them, the amount charged to pay someone to do a clean up would expend all his funding on one project. Code enforcement opened 17 new cases, closed 24, and have 96 outstanding cases at this time.
- e. **Golden State Water – Tina Gonzalez** – They continue with regular maintenance and operations. We should all have received a letter regarding rates.
