

WHEN IS A GRADING PERMIT REQUIRED?

BUILDING INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS

A grading permit is most commonly required if:

- 1. Excavating greater than 5 feet deep or more than 200 cubic yards.

 *Note: (50 cubic yards for the cities of Lafayette, Moraga, and Orinda)
- 2. Placing fill to support any structure, fill deeper than 3 feet, or more than 200 cubic yards. **Note:** (50 cubic yards for the cities of Lafayette, Moraga, and Orinda)

Per County Ordinance Code Section <u>716-4.202-204</u>, other conditions may also trigger a grading permit.

Please note that for all grading permits involving 1000 cubic yards or more, nearby neighbors will be notified prior to permit issuance, see County Ordinance 716-4.202 (e).

What to submit for a grading permit application:

Three (3) sets of grading plans stamped and signed by a licensed California Civil Engineer or Architect and two copies of a geotechnical report.

For a full description of the submittal requirements, see County Ordinance <u>716-4.602</u>, <u>604</u>, <u>606</u>, <u>608</u>, and for soil reports, see County Ordinance <u>716-4.804</u>.

PERMIT PROCESS

Building Permit Review

1. Apply online on our ePermits Center at https://epermits.cccounty.us. You will first need to register for an account. Contractors and Contractor agents must connect a CSLB license to their online account and can apply for permits after staff has approved the license.

Inspections

- 1. Periodic inspection as determined by County Grading Inspector.
- 2. Review of 3rd party compaction test reports.
- 3. Final inspection by County Grading Inspector.
