Current Projects

In addition to ongoing economic development programs like business outreach, small business ombudsperson services, and targeted industry attraction, the County Department of Conservation and Development has current special projects that support our business community. These include:

- Northern Waterfront Economic
 Development Initiative, a collaborative process to enhance the vitality of the County along the northern edge, parallel to the Delta and Highway 4.
- Short line rail feasibility study, to further enhance connectivity and business options along our main rail lines.
- Cannabis use regulations to better define the approval process for new "cannabusinesses."
- Incentives like Opportunity Zones, a new federal program, and Recycling Market Development Zone low-interest loans.


