2. STAFF/AGENCY REPORTS

- B. District II Staff Update The next Alamo Liaison meeting is scheduled for Monday, December 17th, 2019, beginning at 8:30 a.m.
- C. District II Holiday Open House, Wednesday, December 12th from 4:00p.m. to 6:00p.m.
- D. District Representative, Jen Quallick, offered report on Special District's Livorna Park Tree Inventory Management Plan. In November, CCC PW contracted with Davey Resource Group to conduct an inventory of trees in Livorna Park. Goal is to provide strategies to manage trees that may impact infrastructure, park visitors, and to guide long-term tree care decisions.

Three (3) trees are recommended for removal and approximately 25 that require pruning/trimming for longevity of life and beautification. The cost of the service is \$16,007.36. There will be an information sign installed on the bulletin board to help inform park users of the service being provided once the work is scheduled.

E. No representative was available from Fire District to offer report.

6. OLD BUSINESS

A. Downtown Alamo Roundabout Update as provided by Transportation Engineer, Jerry Fahy – The team preliminarily determined the limits of fee title acquisition and temporary construction easements adjacent property owners. Design Team and PW discussed the project with Real Estate and they will initiate preliminary work, including reaching out to the property owners to set up a meeting (date & time TBD). The meeting will potential include general project design, including potential parking loss, landscape maintenance, etc.

NEPA was approved on October 25, 2018.

Design is working towards 65%. Completion. Team had conversation with consultant W-Trans, on October 10th, 2018, regarding streetlight requirements. It was determined that 4 streetlights would be required at the roundabout. Design has also determined that landscaping strips along the perimeter of the roundabout will be necessary for truck turning, to serve as a barrier for the truck overhang as the vehicle moves through the roundabout.

B. Hemme Station Park Update as provided by Transportation Engineer, Jerry Fahy – On 11/20, the County contracted with NCE to conduct ground penetrating radar work to investigate the possibility of an underground storage tank in the ROW along Danville Blvd. and Hemme Station Park. Some anomalies were discovered and the crew was back out onsite on 11/28 to conduct some boring and potholing work to see what was underground. A concrete pad and tank were uncovered adjacent to the parks fence along Danville Blvd. An additional investigation will be conducted for the possibility of a second storage tank. PW is not entirely certain as to the completion time of this work. The County will continue to do whatever is necessary to ensure the safety of its residents at Hemme Station Park.
