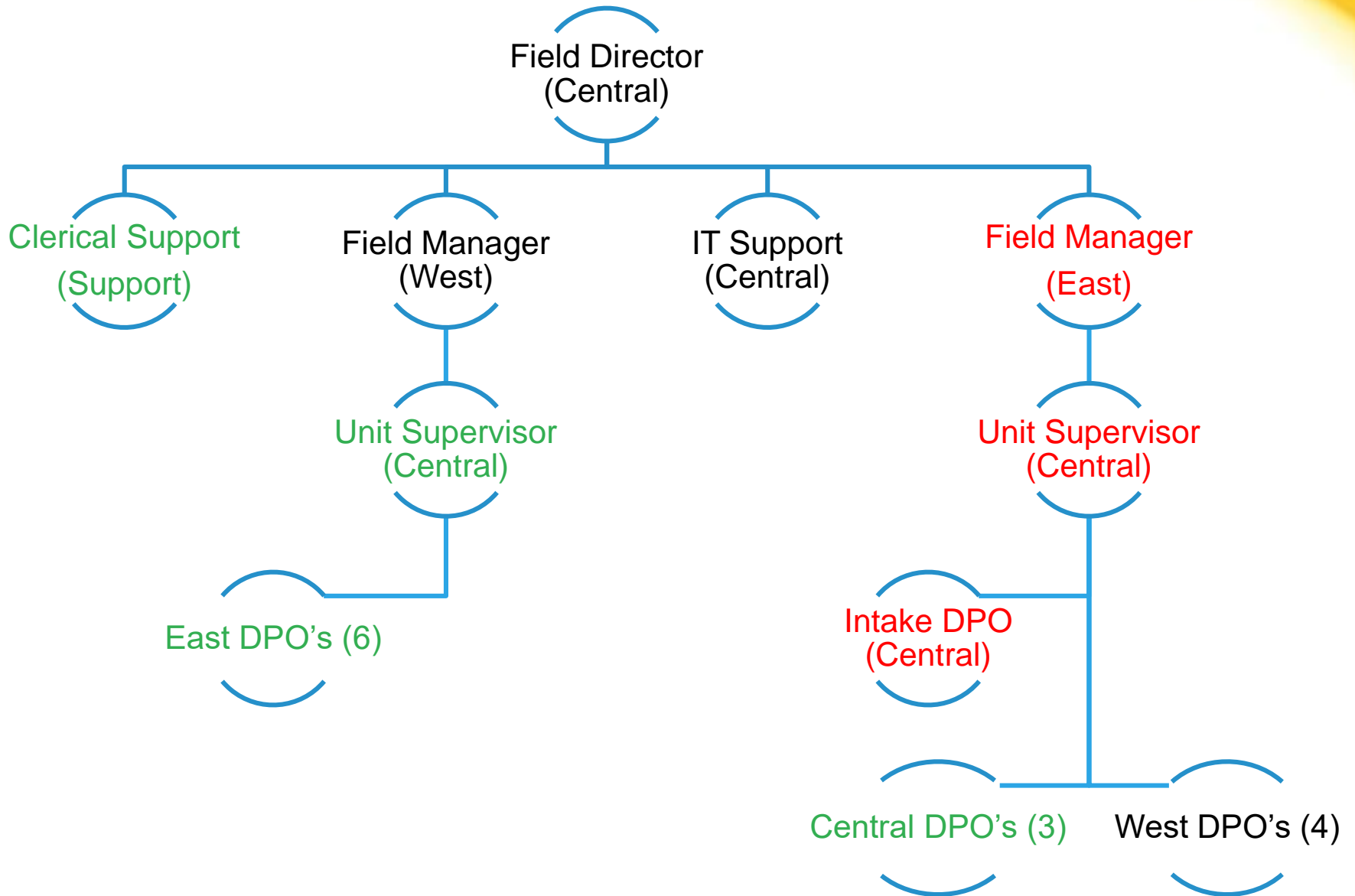

AB 109 SUPERVISION POPULATION

1170(h) Supervision

Mandatory supervision as part of sentence from court where sentence is split between time in local jail and remainder of sentence on supervision by Probation Department.

Post Release Community Supervision

Custodial sentence spent in state prison for a crime that could be sentenced to county jail, and upon release the person is on PRCS supervision by Probation Department.

PROBATION'S ROLE IN AB-109

1. Provide effective community supervision of the AB-109 population
2. Identify client needs, and make appropriate referrals
3. Facilitate case coordination efforts that promote positive outcomes
4. Support the smooth operation of various system components

COMMUNITY SUPERVISION

1. Manage and reduce recidivism risk among the AB-109 population
 - a) Use evidence based practices to increase the likelihood of successful community reintegration
 - b) Balance sanctions and services to promote behavior change

2. Monitor client compliance with court orders and terms of supervision
 - a) Hold clients accountable for their behavior
 - b) Use sanctions and incentives to encourage pro-social behaviors
