

Marie Porter

Marie Porter Park is located at the intersection of Kilburn Street and Norman Avenue in Clyde. The park is named after Marie Porter, a longtime resident of Clyde, who championed the renowned architectural firm Maybeck & Applegarth to map out the town in 1918. Maybeck & Applegarth's vision created an intimate, pedestrian-oriented neighborhood setting, which included four parks.

Directions from Martinez

- ◇ Take CA-4 E toward  Stockton/ Interstate 680
- ◇ Take Exit 15B for Port Chicago Hwy. 
- ◇ Keep left at the fork, follow signs for Port Chicago Hwy. N and merge ,  onto Port Chicago Hwy.
- ◇ Continue on Port Chicago Hwy. 
- ◇ Turn right onto Norman Ave.
