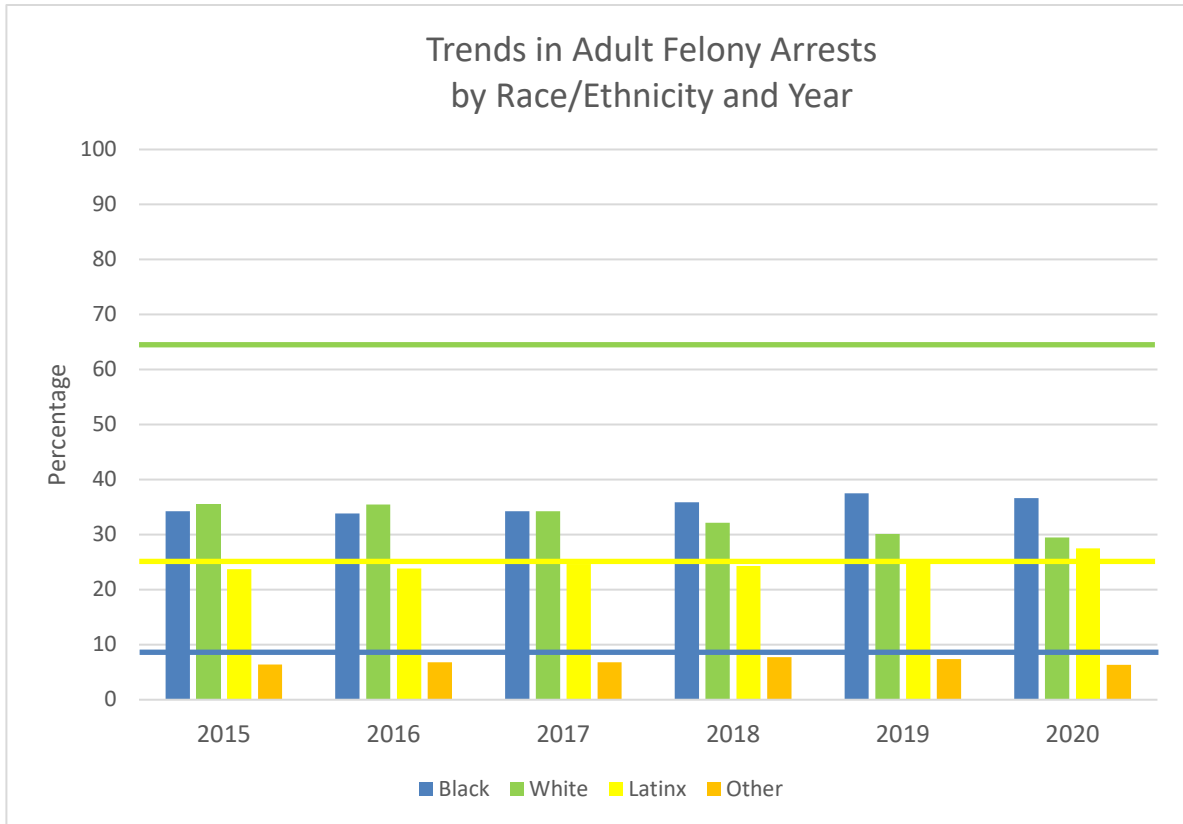


Key Takeaways:

- White adults were arrested for misdemeanors at a higher rate each year compared to other racial/ethnic groups.
- Of all misdemeanor arrests, 25% were among Black adults and another 25% were among Latinx adults for every year shown.
- Black adults were overrepresented among adult misdemeanor arrests by 2-3x their distribution in the general population for every year shown.
- Latinx adults were arrested at comparable rates to their distribution in the general population for every year shown.

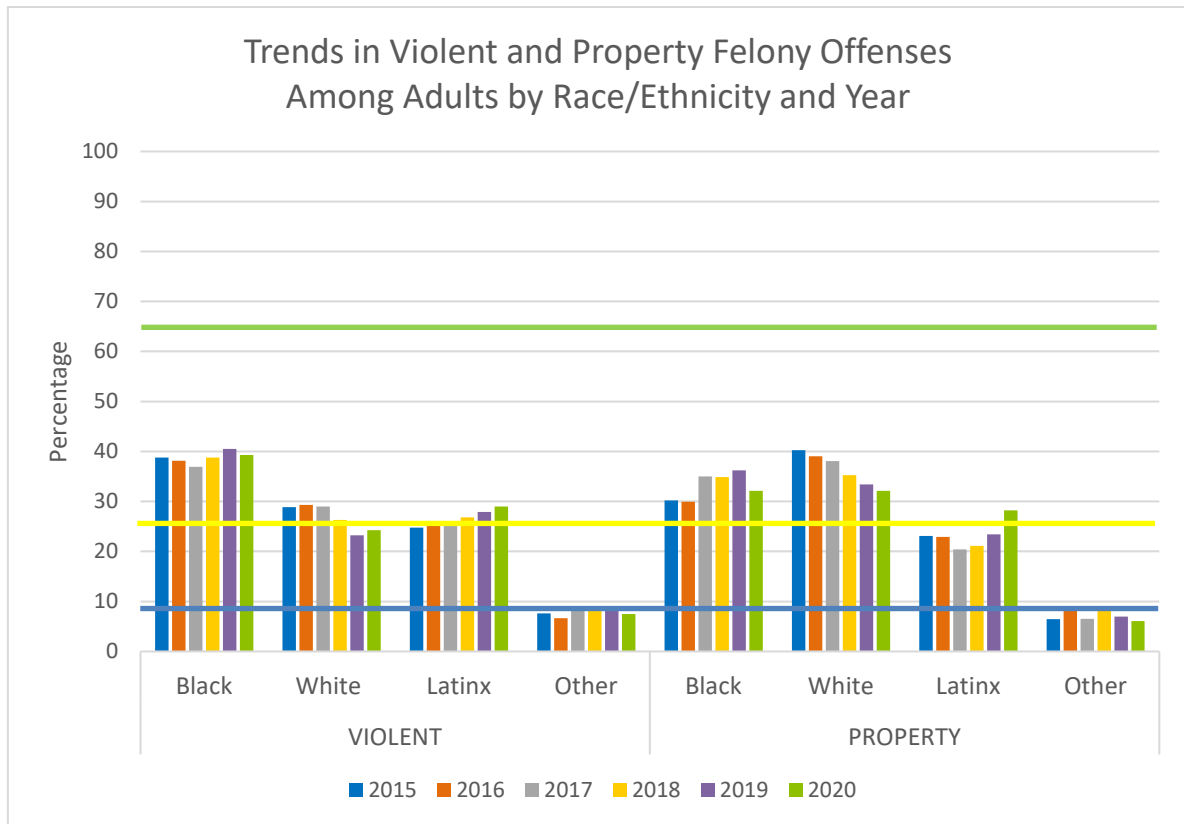


Key Takeaways:

- On average, Black and White adults had similar rates of felony arrests during the 2015-2017 time period. Beginning in 2018, a slight decrease in felony arrests can be seen among White adults.
- It is worth noting that the distribution of felony arrests among Black adults was approximately 4x greater than their distribution in the general population, while Latinx adults were arrested at a comparable rate to their distribution in the general population.

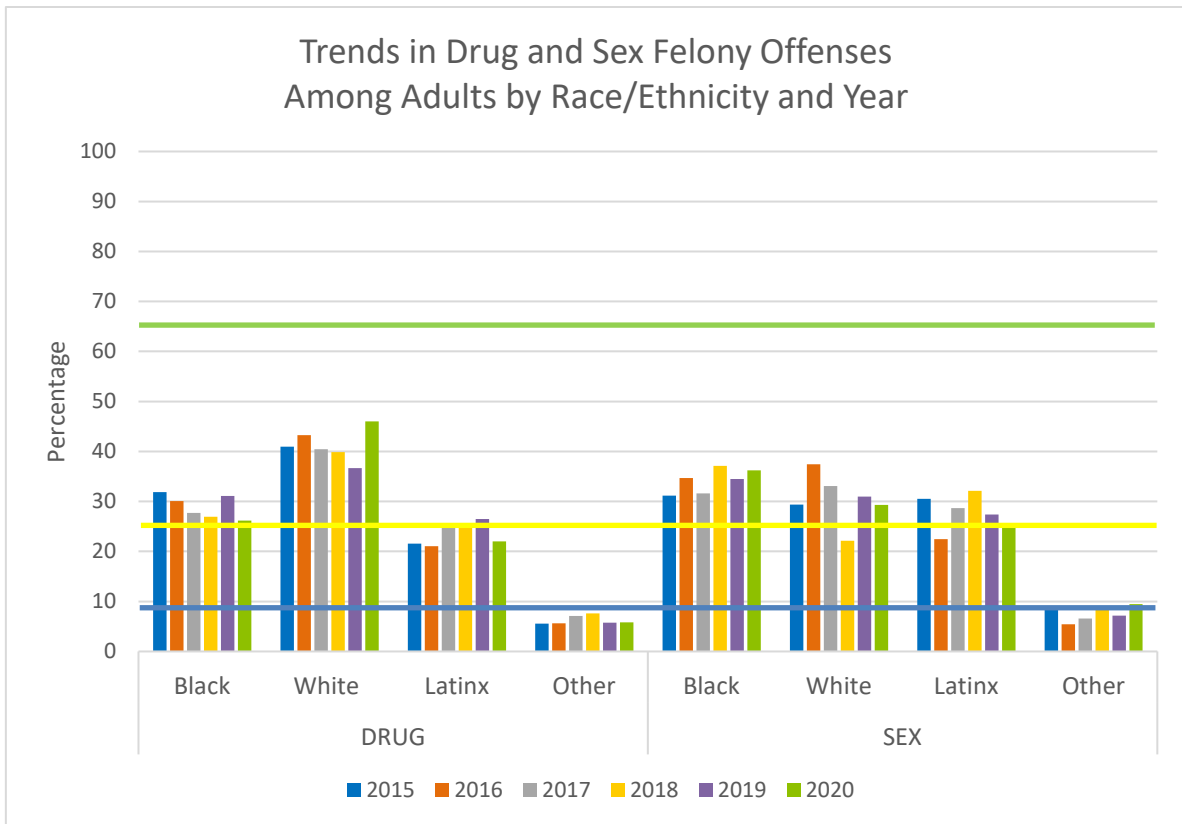


Key Takeaways:

- At each year shown, Black adults experienced the highest rates of arrest for violent offenses.
- White adults experienced the highest rates of arrest for property offenses.
- Whether for a violent or property offenses, Black adults experienced rates of arrest that were 3-4x greater than their distribution in the general population.

Key Takeaways:

- White adults experienced the highest rates of arrest for drug offenses compared to other racial/ethnic groups.
- While Black adults were arrested at a lower rate for drug offenses compared to White adults, the rates of arrest for drug offenses among Black adults were 2-3x greater than their distribution in the general population.
- As it relates to arrests for sex offenses, Black adults were overrepresented at a rate 2-3x greater than their distribution in the general population.
