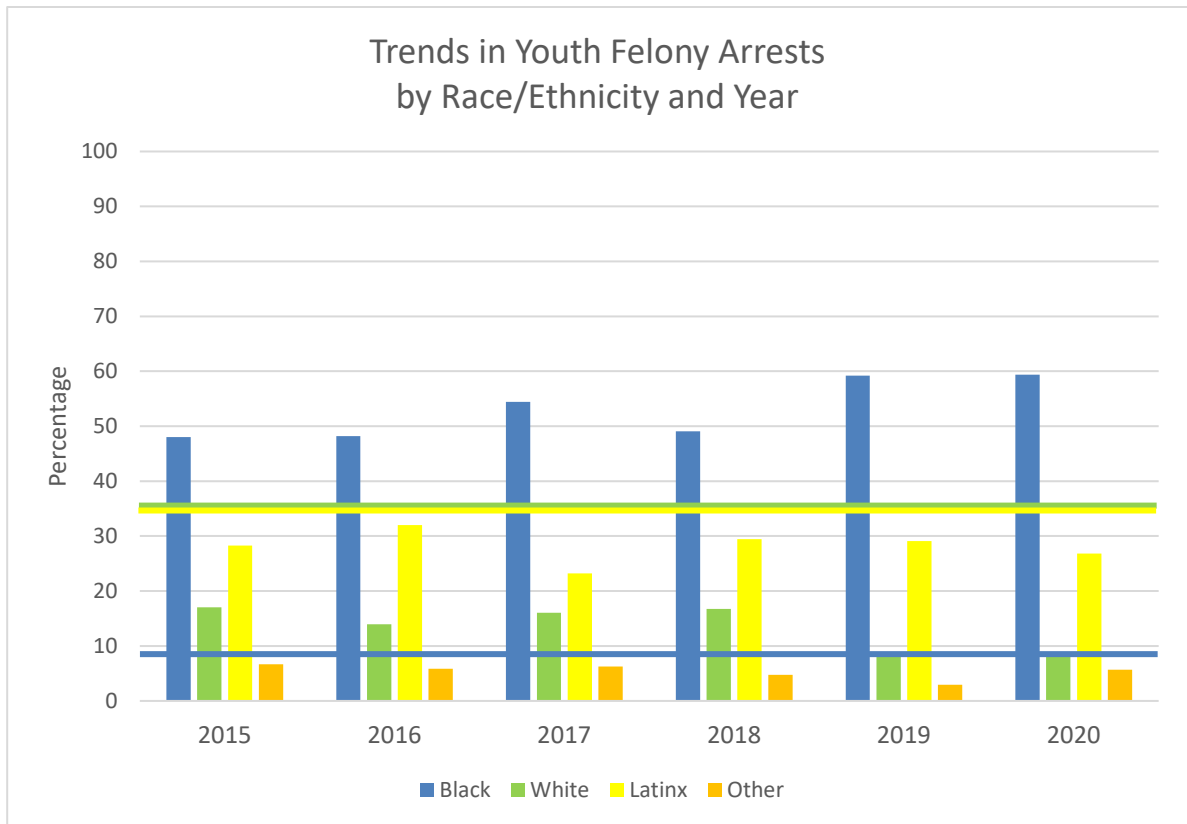


Key Takeaways:

- Not unlike felony arrests, Black youth experienced the highest rates of arrest for misdemeanors.
- These rates of arrest for misdemeanors among Black youth were 4-5x greater than their distribution in the general population for every year shown.

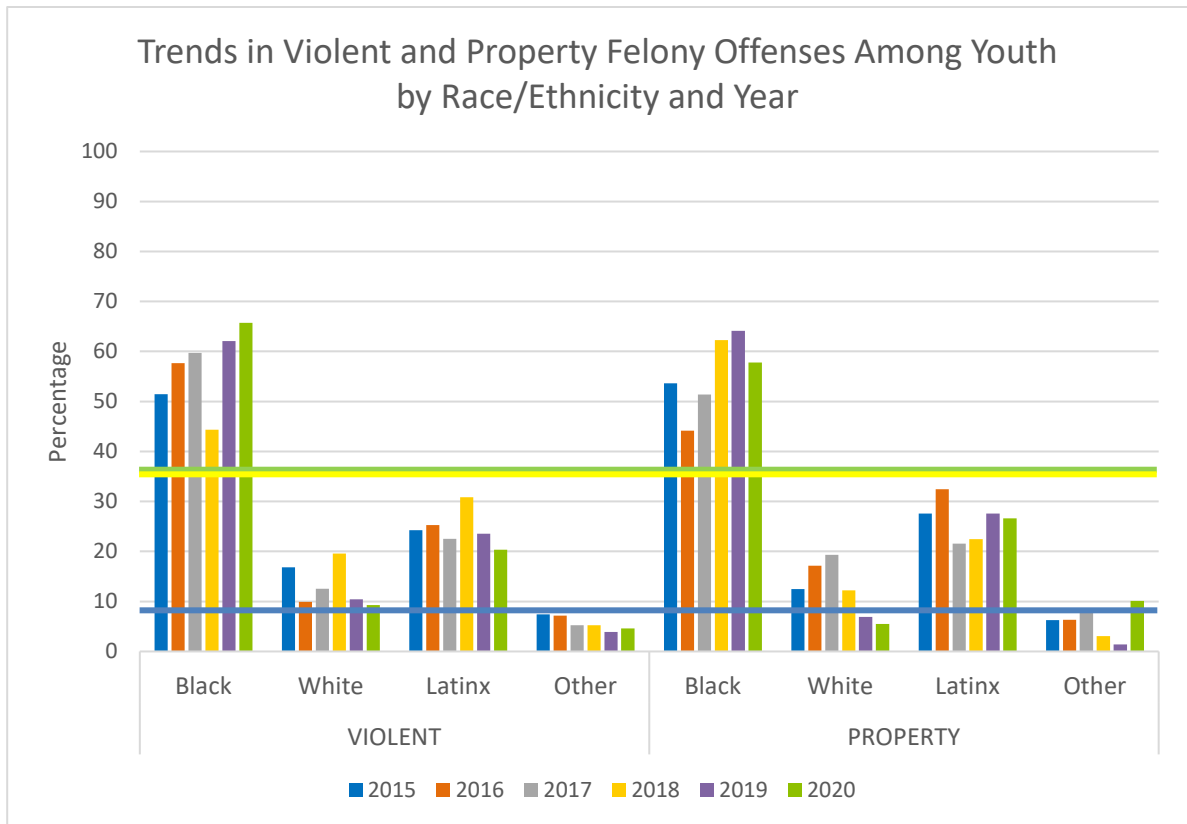


Key Takeaways:

- Not unlike misdemeanor arrests, Black youth experienced the highest rates of arrest for felonies.
- These rates of arrest for felonies among Black youth were approximately 5-6x greater than their distribution in the general population for every year shown.

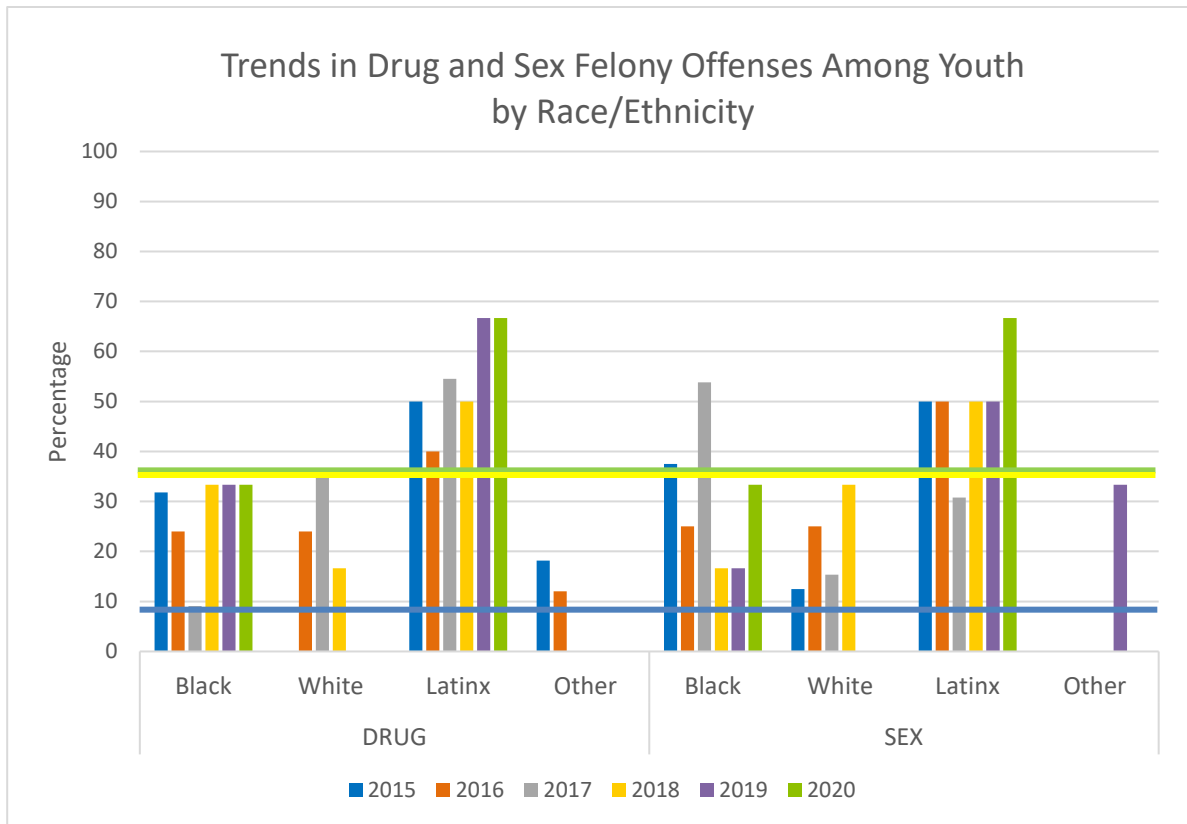


Key Takeaways:

- At each year shown, Black youth experienced the highest rates of arrest for both violent and property offenses.
- These rates of arrest among Black youth for violent and property offenses were, in general, over 5x greater than their distribution in the general population.
